Eyewear company to provide colorblind veterans in Fayetteville with special glasses

FAYETTEVILLE, N.C. (WNCN) – A California eyewear company partnered with the Fayetteville Lions Club 31N to help colorblind veterans see in full color the American flag they protect.

On Thursday for Veteran's Day, EnChroma said it will give colorblind veterans and active-duty military personnel glasses that help correct colorblindness. The company said it also donated a set of the glasses to the JFK Special Warfare museum so that colorblind visitors can experience the exhibits in full color.

"Veterans and military service members who are color blind cannot see the red stripes in the very flag they protect," said Erik Ritchie, CEO of EnChroma. "We are proud to donate our glasses to the JFK Special Warfare Museum and show our appreciation to veterans."

According to EnChroma, about 1-of-12 men and 1-in-200 women are colorblind. The company estimated that about 1 million of the nearly 19 million veterans in America are colorblind.

Colorblind people only see about 10 percent of the hues and shades that others see.

VSP Voucher Program

Good day fellow Lions,

As many of you know, the Matching Funds Program was sidelined in September of 2020. In the absence of Matching Funds, we have been blessed to work with the VSP Voucher Program. VSP is an insurance company that is providing VSP Vouchers to Lions Club International.

These VSP Vouchers can be used at any participating VSP Provider for an eye exam and/or glasses, at no cost to the patient or Your Lions Club.

There are several requirements set by VSP to determine if a patient qualifies for the VSP Voucher Program.

- 1) The patient may not have received assistance from VSP in the past 12 months.
- 2) The patient is not eligible for a VSP Voucher if already covered by Government or Private Insurance, which covers the service needed.
- 3) Must meet 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

VSP Vouchers must be applied for and received before a patient goes to an eye doctor for service. This is just the opposite of the Matching Funds Program.

When you have a client that is requesting help, you will need to determine which voucher type best fits your patient's needs as there are three different types of vouchers available.

- 1. The **Sight for Students** Voucher, covers exam and glasses for students age 19 and under.
- 2. The Materials Only Voucher, covers just materials (Frames and Lenses). The Materials Only Voucher would typically be used when a patient has Medicare or if the patient was able to pay for the exam but could not afford the glasses. Medicare will typically cover an eye exam for medical reasons but will not cover glasses, except one time after cataract surgery. Medicare will only cover an eye exam when there is a medical reason such as Diabetes, Cataracts, Dry Eyes, Glaucoma and many other health related issue, which can affect the eye.

3. The **Full Coverage** Voucher, which covers Exam and Glasses for adults over the age of nineteen. The VSP Vouchers are easy to apply for and are accepted by many VSP Doctors across the state. VSP has a website, so you/or the patient can check and see what doctors accept the vouchers. The VSP website is <u>https://www.vsp.com/eye-doctor.</u>

Once you determine which type of VSP Voucher best fits the needs of your client, you will then need to complete a VSP Voucher Information Form. This form is now available on the North Carolina Lions website <u>https://nclionsinc.org/program</u>

forms/. Once the VSP Information Form is completed, return it to me at NCLI. We will then complete the voucher request and if all qualifications are met, we will mail the voucher to the Lion who's contact information is included on the VSP Voucher Information Form. That Lion would then either deliver the VSP Voucher to the patient or in some cases Lions may prefer to take the VSP Voucher to a doctor's office and get the office to call the patient and schedule the exam. We have found this helps to prevent the patient from losing the VSP Voucher, which is non-replaceable once in the patient's hands.


