Greetings, Lions of 31N...

When Lion Pat Ryan, of the Bluegrass Lion's Club, was a child, his grandmother came to live with his family. One thing Ryan noticed quickly was that his grandmother had two different sized feet – size 10 on her right and size 8 on her left. The reason? She had all of her toes amputated from her left foot due to diabetes complications. This was Ryan's first experience with the disease, but it would not be his last

With Ryan taking the lead, the Bluegrass Lions put together a two-year plan aimed at reducing the prevalence of diabetes and improving the quality of life for those diagnosed. With the help of a \$67,500 LCIF Diabetes grant, the Bluegrass Lions have educated and screened thousands of Kentuckians, with plans to reach even more.

To date, the Lions have hosted 28 screening events, which included both A1C screenings and retinal screenings for diabetic retinopathy. More than 240 people with possible diabetes or pre-diabetes were referred to the proper medical professionals.

Lion Brian lived in Southern California his entire life until moving to North Carolina only three years ago. He, his wife Kim, and daughter Megan immediately got involved in their community. Brian is Vice President of the Western Harnett Lions, serves on the board of directors for the local fire department and is the local precinct chair of a major political party. Kim serves as club Secretary, was awarded "newcomer of the year" in our club, and serves on the community affairs committee of Carolina Lakes. Megan serves on the social media committee and volunteers for other club committees. All three of the Hinsleys run the club's largest fundraiser (Golf Tournament), a "Stuff the Bus" Drive for children needing school supplies, and a Mother's Day Breakfast for the community, as well as so much more. The Hinsley's support to the Western Harnett Lions is truly a family affair!

While he was a successful Firefighter Paramedic with Los Angeles County, Lion Brian was diagnosed with autoimmune hepatitis. This diagnosis completely changed his life and threatened his career. He battled fatigue, ascites (excessive abdominal fluid), anemia, hepatic encephalopathy (mental confusion due to ammonia build-up), and other side effects due to chronic liver failure.

Lead By Example


