21st CENTURY MOBILE SCREENING UNIT PROGRAM COMMITTEE

This new committee met on June 8th to discuss the formation of the committee and the history of the Mobile Screening Unit. Members of the committee are as follows: Diane Whitley-State Chairperson, Curtis Erickson-District 31-L, Wayne Houser-District 31-L, Jon Snelling-District 31-I, Gene Goetz-District 31-N, Ron Beltran-District 31-S. This committee will be advised by the Ad Hoc Committee Members: Carlton Metts, Dale Dupree, Harvey Whitley, and Bryan Hoover.

KIDSIGHT PROGRAM

For KidSight screenings five Chevrolet Equinox vehicles have been purchased to be used and located in each district. The vehicles are in the shop now having a graphics wrap applied. Each vehicle will be equipped with two Plusoptix vision screeners and will be equipped to perform hearing testing. North Carolina school administration has issued their authorization to use Plusoptix screening in public schools, so in the future we expect schools to depend on Lions to provide vision screening at local schools.

Area Lions clubs can have the KidSight unit visit their community for \$150. The screening unit will be stored by Lion Gene Goetz so it will never be more than three hours from any District 31-N Lions Club. Clubs will be required to provide assistance at each screening. Training to use the Plusoptix screening unit will be available. Details on training such as location and time will follow.

MOBILE SCREENING UNIT PROGRAM

Function of the Mobile Screening Unit is the same as previous years. But as we see increased costs, especially fuel, we realize the need to increase the cost of this unit. The cost to have this unit visit a community is \$250 plus \$.60 per mile. Bryan Hoover has been working with clubs to coordinate visit dates with clubs in similar geographical areas. By consolidating club's costs can be lower for each individual club.
