

Moving A Mountain,

The Marquette Lions envisioned a simple three-hour event to collect and recycle empty, refundable aluminum cans.

But they ended up moving a mountain — a mountain of 81,501 empty beverage cans worth 10 cents apiece, and it earned them more than US\$8,100 for children battling cancer in Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

Club Vice President Mary Rule initiated the event as a way for her club to make some money at a time when five of their fundraising events had been canceled due to COVID-19.



Community members had just come out of a long snowy winter when the pandemic “stay at home” orders were announced. To top it off, COVID-19 had put a stop to stores accepting recycled cans, and so people in Michigan who had paid the usual 10-cent deposit on a can had no way to return them and get their deposit back until restrictions were lifted. They were stockpiling them. And like Rule, growing frustrated not only with having to stay home, but staying home with all these cans.

For hours on end, Lions in gloves and masks, with adherence to social distancing guidelines, gave curbside service by going to vehicles for bags, boxes, and often entire truck beds full of cans.

As one donor said, “Who doesn't support sick kids?”

## BEAUFORT LIONS CLUB NEWS

### Beaufort Lions Club Navilens Project

Beaufort NC Lions Club funds Navilens Informational-Transfer/Mobility Project for the Blind at the Beaufort NC Maritime Museum.

The Beaufort NC Lions Club is proud to announce a donation, in the amount of \$4200, to the Friends of the NC Maritime Museum. This donation will directly fund the installation of a Navilens Informational-Transfer/Mobility package within the Beaufort NC Maritime Museum, capable of providing self-guided personal tours, with access to the many hidden stories associated to displayed coded artifacts. This action represents the first step towards establishment of “Interactive Experiences” for the Blind, a core component of the planned all-inclusive “Beaufort Blind Project”; an



accessibility package being developed with adherence to “Blind Perspective Philosophical Principals”, thus providing accessibility to all visual acuities, Totally Blind to Fully Sighted. Navilens is an application developed in Spain. It uses color codes that, when captured by a smart phone camera, either

iPhone or Droid, will provide access to associated content. Navilens codes have often been referred to as “QR codes on Steroids”. While this statement is true, in actuality they are so much more! Navilens codes differ dramatically in

comparison to QR codes, as Navilens codes ,do not require prior knowledge of posted code location, or requires the user to take a picture of the

code to access associated information. When the Navilens app is opened, and a scanning of the space is made, using the phone’s rear camera, will allow for automatic capture of posted Navilens

codes, granting access to associated information.

Navilens has unique identification and navigational properties, when made available for use by the Blind, which will dramatically improve independence. Navilens codes can be identified from long distances, as the size of the posted Navilens code increases so does the distance from which the code may be captured. A quarter-page size posted code may be captured from up to a distance of 30 feet and then will accurately guide the Blind user, via audible 3D prompting to within one foot of the posted code. Truly amazing in comparison to the unacceptable accuracy errors, forced upon the Blind by GPS! Navilens is also available as free downloadable codes for personal use by the Blind, and represents a perfect example of how smart phone applications, provided at no cost to the enduser, can improve quality of life for the Blind, without the necessity for purchase of additional costly stand alone adaptivetechonology devices.

## WESTERN HARNETT LIONS CLUB—KEEPING A PIECE OF AMERICA BEAUTIFUL

The Western Harnett Lions Club is now in its 18<sup>th</sup> year of picking up trash along a busy two-mile stretch of road in western Harnett County. The club joined the North Carolina Adopt-a-Highway program in February 2004 with past District Governor Vince Schimmoller serving as our Project Coordinator. Since joining the Adopt-a-Highway Program the club's Lions have gathered once a month early on a Saturday morning to clean up our designated section of road. For the last two years our LEO club has been assisting us. Their help is greatly appreciated and has been instrumental in reducing the amount of time it takes to finish our cleanup from an hour and a half to about an hour. The club's efforts over the last 12 months have yielded 237 bags of trash along with car bumpers, pieces of furniture, and an occasional empty barrel or other large container.

While at times it can feel frustrating when you drive by the day after we completed a trash pickup and see new trash on the side of the road, it is also very rewarding seeing the before and after of the road after the cleanup knowing we are still helping to keep our neighborhood a little nicer. Additionally, the participants' efforts continue to enhance the Lion Club's reputation in our community, as evidenced by the positive feedback we receive from residents, business owners, and even drivers passing by while we work.

Besides a sense of satisfaction and accomplishment, a side benefit of participating in one or more of the monthly pickups is the chance to gather with our fellow Lions outside the setting of a meeting. Once finished, we usually meet at a local coffee shop for a little fellowship and to compare notes on our most interesting "trash finds" of the morning.


