# **KIDSIGHT SCREENING UNIT**

The KidSight vehicles have arrived! There is one in every district in North Carolina. For district 31-N the vehicle is housed in the Goldsboro area and is ready for dispatch to your community.

On December 6, 7, 8, and 9 there were KidSight screenings with the Clinton club, there were no problems and all went well. We screened children at 8 elementary schools in samson county. A total of 641 kids were screened with 171 referrals, a 27% referral rate.

A cheer goes out to Lion Kay West and the Clinton Lions Club, their preparation with the schools was excellent! For a club of 15 members to organize and run a screening this large was quite a task. But the Clinton Lions Club made it look easy by making use of community volunteers. Kay mentioned to me at the Mid-Winter convention that there were 2 or 3 people who expressed interest in joining their club after the screenings. A great example of how a club can increase membership by using community volunteers for a service project.

### **KIDSIGHT TRAINING**

District training sessions will start soon. Because the Beaufort Lions Club expressed interest, I'm looking at that general area for the first training session in the district. Tentatively the first training session is planned for March. I'll get information to you on the time and location. Future training sessions will be held in other areas within the district.

# **DISTRICT 31-N CLUB SCREENING**

Clubs with their own cameras either Welch Allen Spot or PlusOptix are doing a great job. Here are the statistics from December through January.

Western Harnett LC	screened 1,240 with 111 referrals	8.9%
Wilmington LC	screened 171 with 25 referrals	14.6%

During the holidays screening numbers are expected to be lower. I know there are more clubs with cameras so I'm hoping the numbers will increase as we approach the new school year. Please remember to let your district KidSight Chairperson Gene Goetz know how many kids you screen, their ages, number of referral's, location of screening, and your club's name. ggoetz00@gmail.com

Clubs with Welch Allyn Spot screeners should be aware that their devices may be getting close to the end of your 5-year service agreement. Beware that out of warranty maintenance could be expensive. Welch Allen recommends that your battery be replaced after 2.5 years, the battery is covered under the service agreement. A new battery alone will cost \$144 and basic service is \$268 if your device is passed the 5-year agreement.

Call Welch Allyn customer service at 800-535-6663 please call to confirm that your covered under a service agreement.
