Greetings Fellow Lions;

So I want you to think of Camp Dogwood as your home as each of us Lions in the state own a part of it. And last is District Governor monetary goals. As a cabinet we decided to keep it \$22.00 per member and the district dues are kept at \$19.50 per member.

Last, you should have seen an advertisement for the Brighter Visions & Camp Dogwood Campaign Kick-off that was emailed to every member on the email list. The date is August 19 at 10 am with the 1st Cabinet meeting following. I look forward to seeing all of the clubs represented and bring your first Brighter Visions check to jump start our Lions Year.
