From the your KIDSIGHT district chair

The Mobile Screening Programs Committee under the direction of our new state chair Lion Jon Snellings has been working hard putting together a revised Kidsight training manual. The new manual is easily accessed at https://nclf.org/ by picking Program Forms then scroll down to "See the 21st Century Screening Program" pick on KidSight Screening Manual 6.19.24 and you'll have it!

Regardless if your club is using your own camera, Welch Allan Spot or PlusOptix, or you plan on using the KidSight vehicle we welcome you to use this new training manual or attend training. You may have been screening kids for many years but "Who knows", you may find some information that helps at your screenings.

After 4 training sessions, 65 members went through a 5-hour training session since September of 2023. There were 13 Lions at the last training in Spring Lake. A big thank you to the Liberty Lions Club and the Fayetteville Massey Hill Lions Club for sponsoring this training. Our next training session will be sponsored by the Lake Waccamaw Lions Club on September 28, at 506 Lake Shore Dr. in Lake Waccamaw. More information will be sent out on this training opportunity.
